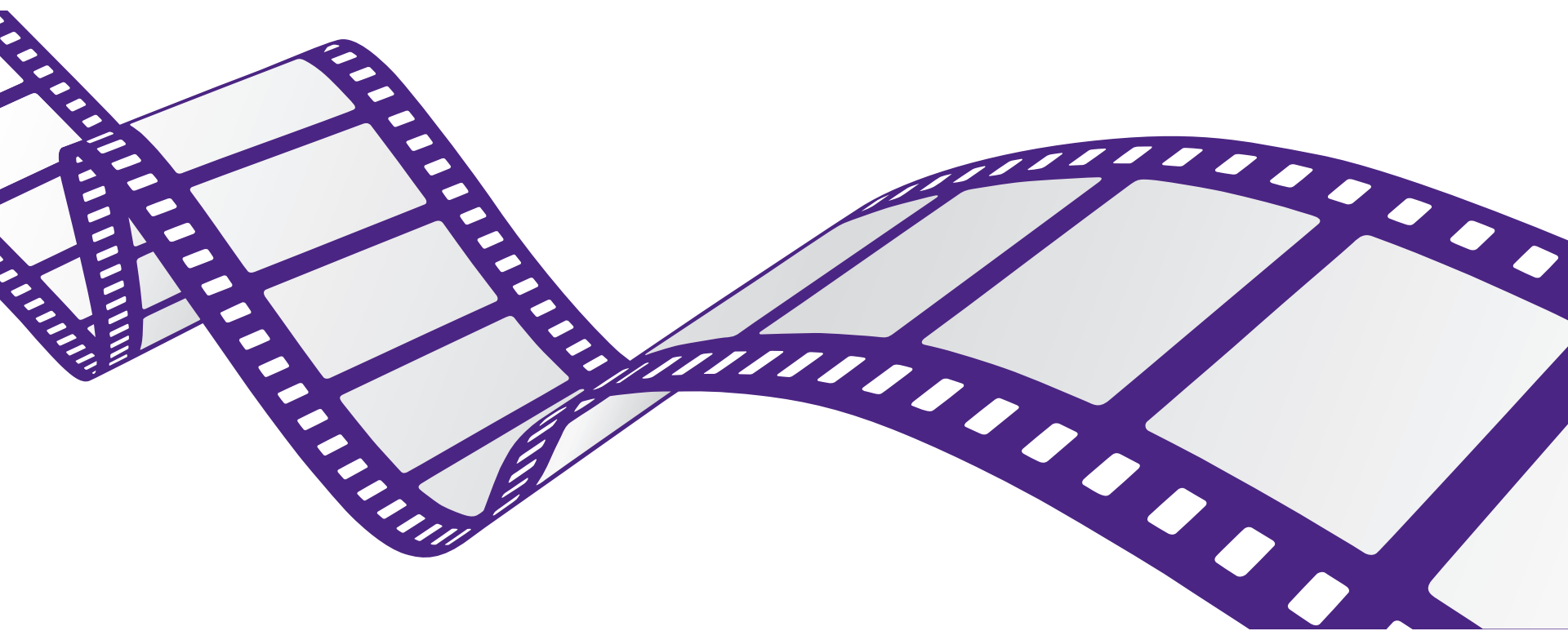

Your guide to **WELCOME WEEK**



Orientation Leaders | Orientation Leaders (OLs) are student leaders at the University of Evansville. Extensive training and hard work have gone into putting this program together. Our goal is to assist you in your transition to UE. Please do not hesitate to ask your OL about anything.

Purple Pods and Purple Huddles | Each of you has been assigned to a small group (Purple Pod) for Welcome Week. Each day, you'll come together with your Purple Pod for a Purple Huddle. Your OL will be there to support and guide you through the week. If you did not meet your OL at registration, be sure to ask any OL for the name of your small group. Food, fun, great friends, and adventures await!

Academic Convocation | On Tuesday, you'll take part in the University of Evansville's official academic welcome, a tradition that marks the beginning of your collegiate journey. During this formal ceremony, you'll hear from University leadership, faculty, and student representatives as you're welcomed into the UE academic community. This is a meaningful moment to reflect on the path ahead and the values that unite us as Purple Aces. If you have any questions, ask an OL or visit the Welcome Week Help Desk in Ridgway University Center.

Academic Departmental Meetings – Mandatory on Tuesday as part of Academic Convocation | On Tuesday, you will meet with faculty members and academic leaders from your intended area of study as part of the Academic Convocation programming. This is a great time for you to get to know who will teach the various classes you have registered for and who will serve as your academic mentors during your collegiate career. In your Welcome Week registration packet, there is a listing of the department meetings and where they are located. If you have any questions, ask an OL or contact the Academic Services team, located on the first floor of Olmsted Hall.

Math Mastery Exam | If Math 105 is the only Math course required for your major, and you believe your skills are higher than College Algebra, you can register to take the Math Mastery Exam with the Mathematics Department. Students who are awarded proficiency based on their performance on the test do not have to take this course if required by their major. To schedule this in-person exam during the first week of classes, please contact the Mathematics Department at math@evansville.edu or **812-488-1234**.

Student Life Center | The Division of Student Affairs houses all of the Student Life programs and services. Please refer to your packet for a listing of these offices and where they are located. Most of the offices are on the second floor of Ridgway University Center. If you need any information regarding student life or Welcome Week, you are welcome to stop by and our team will help you in any way we can. The Student Life Center is open Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.

Parking Permits | You can apply online for a parking permit by registering your vehicle through UE Self-Service and downloading the Rave Guardian app, which is used for emergency notifications to campus. Students who are registered full-time (12 hours or more) will be provided a parking permit at no additional cost. Visit selfservice.evansville.edu to register your vehicle (the parking permits link is under UE Forms -> Student -> Parking Permits). Permits will be distributed during the first week of classes in Ridgway University Center.

Meals | Meal swipes as part of your meal plan will begin on Saturday evening for dinner. If you are a commuter student and do not have a meal plan on campus, please see one of the OLs and they will provide you with meal tickets.

The Responsible Good Neighbor Policy underscores the importance of students seeking medical assistance in emergency situations and how the University will consider this decision in light of the Student Code of Conduct. **NEVER hesitate to seek medical assistance—it could be the difference between life and death.**

Ace Alerts and Rave Guardian | The Ace Alerts and Rave Guardian systems are the best ways to quickly communicate a campus emergency to the campus community. Information regarding Ace Alerts and Rave Guardian can be found on the Office of Public Safety's website, www.evansville.edu/safety/emergencysystem.cfm. You will need to download the Rave Guardian app in order to receive any campus parking permits.

Public Safety on Campus | The Office of Public Safety emergency phone line is **812-488-6911**; the non-emergency phone line is **812-488-2051**. The Public Safety website, evansville.edu/safety and the Residence Life website, evansville.edu/residencelife, contain important information relative to security procedures and emergency protocols. All members of the campus community are encouraged to familiarize themselves with these procedures regardless if they live on campus or commute. The Public Safety website also contains statistics for campus crime and the Clery Report, as well as instructions for reporting suspicious behavior on campus.

Mental Health Counselors on Call | Emergency counseling services for urgent or life-threatening situations are available after business hours by calling the Office of Public Safety at **812-488-2051** and requesting to speak to the counselor on call.

University Email | The University recommends all students check their University email account at least once per day, as this is the primary form of communication by the University. For information about your UE account on your smartphone, please visit the OTS website, ots.evansville.edu, or contact the OTS help desk at **812-488-2077**. You can also find them on myue.evansville.edu under department pages.

Personal and Emergency Contact Information | It is important that students provide and update their personal and emergency contact information on file with the University. This information is stored and accessible in UE Self-Service (selfservice.evansville.edu).

Campus Community Info and Events | Visit the UE website's Campus Community tab to find information like the Calendar of Events, the Academic Calendar (including dates the campus is closed), and news headlines. You can also access campus resources including employment opportunities, University Library services, a link to the UE Bookstore, and Athletics information (GoPurpleAces.com). To access Self-Service and Blackboard, visit the MyUE portal at myue.evansville.edu.

Student Organization and Events on UEngage | UEngage is the University of Evansville's central platform for student involvement. Visit uengage.evansville.edu to explore over 100 student organizations, discover upcoming campus events, and track your co-curricular involvement. Whether you're looking to join a club, attend a social or academic event, or even start your own organization, UEngage makes it easy to connect with the vibrant UE community and make the most of your college experience!

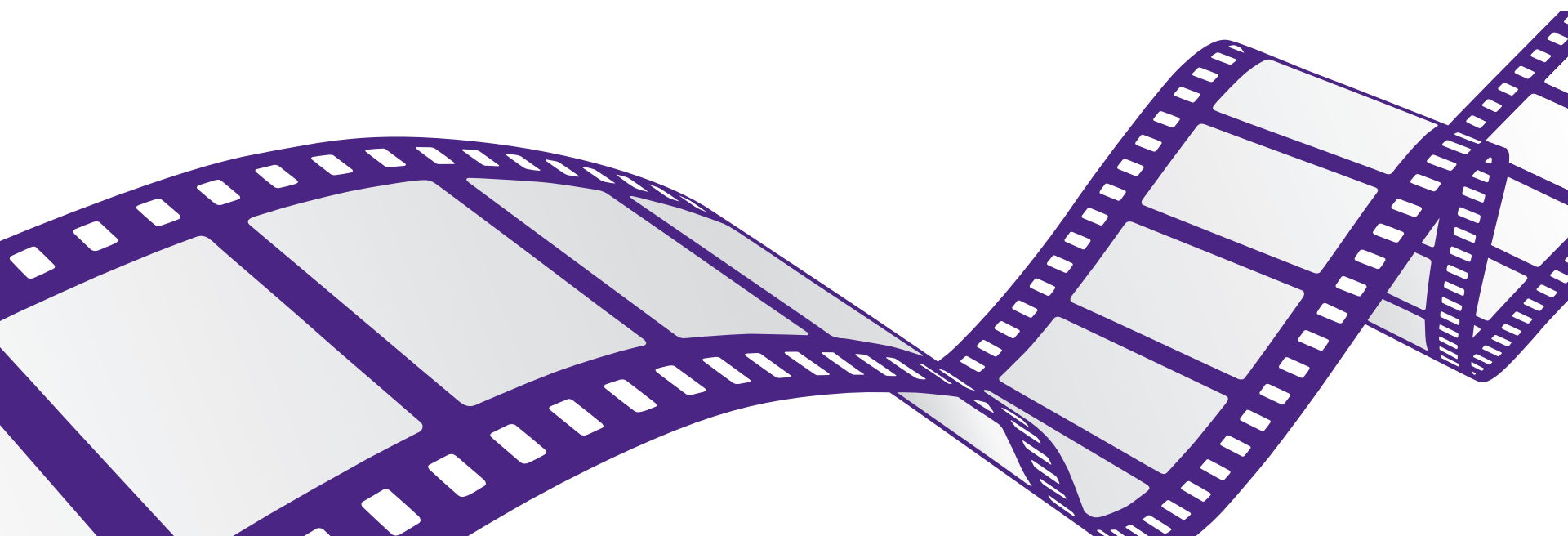


TOP 10 WAYS TO SUCCEED YOUR FIRST YEAR

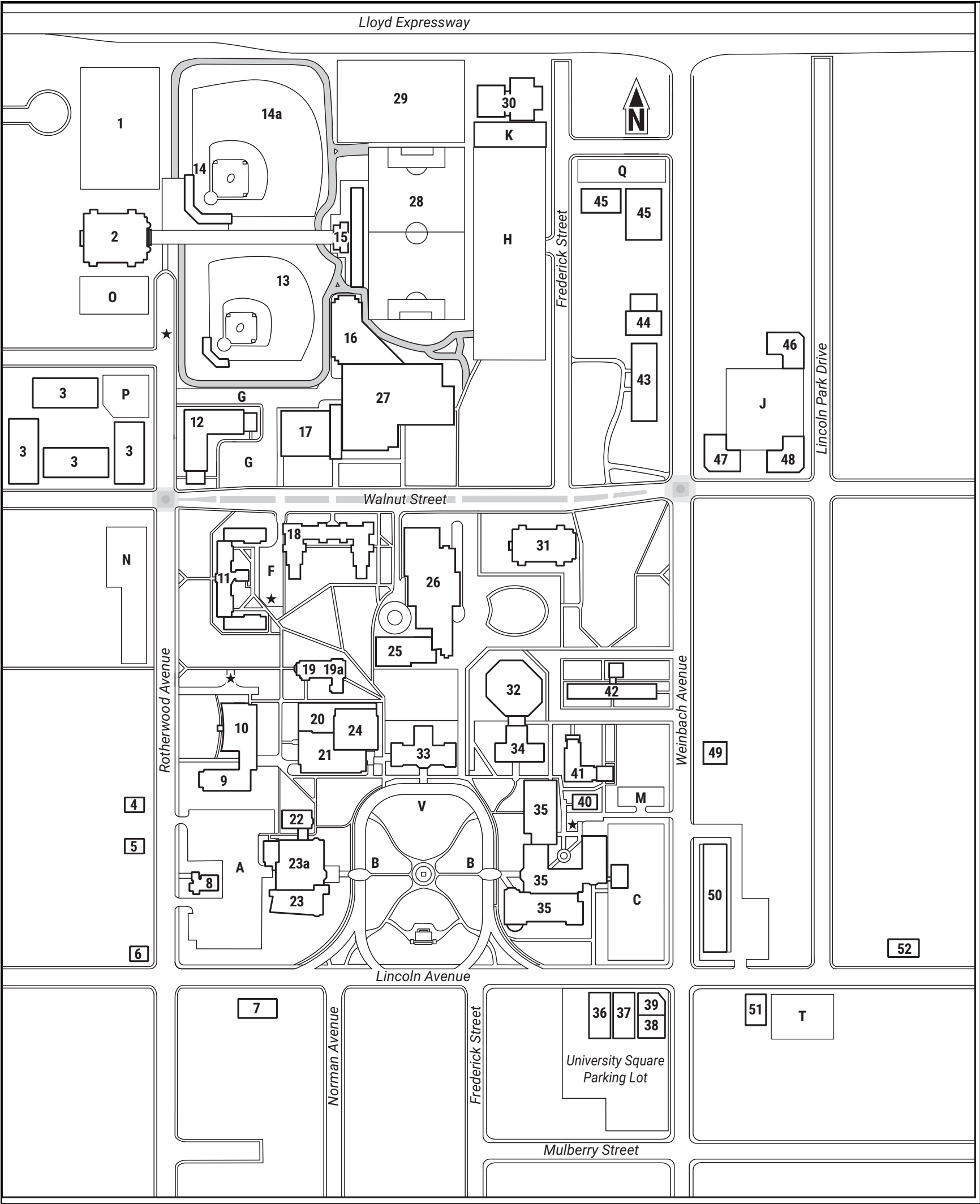

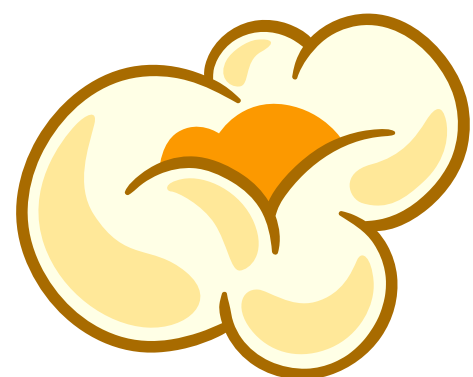
